## CHARITY WAY FOUNDATION

Charity Way Foundation (CWF) was established in the year 1999 in the United States as a 501 (c) (3) U.S. tax-exempt organization. In the last **25 years** of its existence, it has successfully served one of the most poverty-stricken populations in India and Pakistan. In this duration, it reached out to hundreds of thousands of families in Bihar, Jharkhand, Uttarakhand, Uttar Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Telangana states in India, and Sindh in Pakistan. Healthcare, Education, Food, Clothing, Housing, Toilet, Drinking Water, Vocational Training, Marriage Assistance, Small Business, and Winter Clothes distribution are focus areas of the organization.

## MICRO-FINANCING (\$20,607.14)

To foster stability within the bustling metropolis of Karachi, the CWF has joined hands with The Tooba Foundation to provide **interest-free loans** to the neediest people. We have generously disbursed **\$20,607.14** among **201 deserving borrowers**. This financial support not only aids in nurturing small businesses but also fulfils personal needs, thereby empowering individuals to achieve greater financial stability. The recovery of these loans is amazingly above 98%.

## HEALTHCARE (\$312,605.75)

We at CWF put efforts to restore the loss of vision of people living in villages in India due to cataracts. In addition to it, other ailments where surgeries are needed are also taken care of. In Pakistan, we are supporting cardiac patients and providing support for dialysis patients. Medical clinics are operated in both these countries which take care of a large number of patients.

#### INDIA

Cataract eye surgery is one of the oldest and most successful programs of the foundation in India. We organize free health check-up camps and cataract eye surgeries in many villages of Bihar.

We organized **8 health check-up** camps in the villages of Baksauti, Kawakol, Maskor, Bardiha, Sitarampur, Kumhrawan, Rajauli, Makhar villages in Bihar attended by more than **2,500** people. It resulted in the cataract surgeries of more than **468** patients of the age range of 14 to 75 years with all free facilities which include the cost of surgery, blood examination, medicines, spectacles, and meals during the stay in the hospital.

In Patna City, Bihar a medical clinic by the name of Shifa Health Centre has been successfully running since 2006 to provide basic medical care to the population living in the surrounding area. This year, more than **3,500** patients were treated at the cost of **\$1.92** per patient with free basic medications.

In Khatna (circumcision for boys), **266 children** were covered with complete medication that includes tetanus injection in Rasul Nagar, Nawada.

Other surgery assistance and medical support were provided to **3 patients** in the states of Bihar and Jharkhand.

#### PAKISTAN

We provided vital assistance to **1** cardiac patient by supplying two months' worth of essential medication, offering critical support as their heart functioned at only 10%. Additionally, we extended our help to **1** thalassemia patient, ensuring they received necessary post-operative care.

The CWF donated **3** state-of-the-art dialysis machines to the Mohammad Siddiq Memorial Society, enhancing medical care at their Landhi branch in Karachi. Additionally, CWF extended its support to the SSWAB Trust in Karachi, furthering its efforts to provide vital dialysis facilities to those in need. Through these initiatives, CWF continues to make significant strides in improving healthcare accessibility and quality in the community.

Karachi boasts four well-equipped clinics catering to outpatients, each achieving an impressive **98%** medication rate. Strategically located in Lasi Para, Sachal Goth, Goth Dhani Bux, and Kamran Chorangi, these facilities have collectively served a remarkable total of **139,915** patients. What's more, this invaluable service comes at an incredibly affordable cost of just **\$0.65**, ensuring accessible healthcare for all. Beside the **4** above mentioned clinic, CWF supporting **3** other general clinics in the same group of networks, it benefited more than **100,000** patients.

Provided support to AMTF Hospital **2** employees salary and helped around **10** cancer patients.

## EDUCATION (\$73,248.04)

#### INDIA

We, at CWF strongly believe that education empowers people and improves chances of life success. With this thought we are running schools, supporting Maktab, and motivating teachers to perform efficiently.

An-Noor English School at Kawakol in the Nawada district of Bihar was established in 2008 for modern education to the financially challenged neighborhood population. With an enrolment of more than **300 students** with **18 staff**, this school runs from **Playgroup** to **grade 8**. It has a computer and projector used by teachers and students for learning different subjects.

This year a science fair, sports competition, and excursion trip to Krishi Vigyan Kendra were organized in which students and teachers participated and community members appreciated it.

On the campus of the school, a free coaching program sponsored by CWF has been running since **2012** by the name of Rahbar Coaching Centre for **Grade 8** to **10 students** admitted to government schools. It promotes education to mainly girls' students who drop out of school due to financial and social reasons. Total enrolment in this center is **70** with a team of **5** teachers. This year **11** students have appeared in the Grade **10 board** examination.

An-Noor Coaching established in Nawada in **2021** continued with **100** students of **Grade 8 to 10** who showed excellent performances. A new initiative named An-Noor Super Classes, a completely free coaching, lodging, and boarding program for admission to professional courses in reputed universities started. All **20 students** admitted to this program succeeded in various competitive examinations of renowned universities Jamia Millia Islamia (JMI), New Delhi, and other reputed institutions. We are providing accommodation facilities to students studying in the JMI.

In **1998**, a free boarding school named Madarsa Islamia Darul Falah was established in the village of Phuldeeh which gets support from CWF. Presently **30 students** are boarding in this school. Teachers' salaries, food, clothing, and all other expenses are supported by CWF. It provides education to more than **70 students** in the nearby areas who attend shorter-duration classes every day. To encourage students, high-performing students were awarded in this school.





In another school named Madarsa Ishatul-Islam in Bihar Sharif, **2 orphan** students are fully supported by CWF. It includes boarding, lodging, and all other major and minor expenses.

Another school based at Masjid Hayat in Giridih is supported by us having **18 boarders**, **1** teacher, and **1** cook. These students are also admitted to the school for contemporary education.

In Ashraf Jahan Complex at Village Topia, Giridih we are organizing maktab for **250 students** in the neighbourhood. We are supporting other **22** Maktab schools in Jharkhand and **13** in Bihar by taking care of part of the teachers' salaries. These schools are located in remote areas with minimal educational facilities as a result of which these institutions become the only source of education for children. These schools provide basic education to more than **4,000** students.

We supported **10 students** with educational expenses like admission, tuition fees, and books in various institutions.

CWF also supplied books, supporting goods, and other necessary supplies to various schools in Bihar and Jharkhand.

The bonus was awarded to more than **85** teachers and other staff of schools in Jharkhand and Bihar states. This incentive encourages them to improve overall school performance.

#### PAKISTAN

The CWF's dedication to student empowerment soared to new heights as we awarded 100% scholarships to **80** promising Premedical and Pre-Engineering students. These scholarships opened doors to prestigious engineering and medical universities, with all recipients set to enrol in 2024.

Our commitment to education extended beyond scholarships, as we continued to provide essential items like uniforms, shoes, copies, and stationery to students in need across various private and government schools and colleges. In Orangi Town, Delhi Government School, and Shah-Faisal Government High School No 5 in Karachi, a total of **419** students received support, ensuring they have the tools to excel academically and pursue their dreams. Through these efforts, we're not just changing lives; we're cultivating a culture of education, empowerment, and boundless opportunity.

## QURBANI-SADAQA (\$107,167.61)

#### INDIA

This year, **174 cattle** and **125 goats** were offered for Qurbani. This provided meat to more than **7,350 families** in the remote villages of Bihar and Jharkhand. This program provides meat to some of the families who wait for the whole year to receive some meat for their families.

Sadaqa of **10 cattle** provided meat for more than **350 families** and sadaqa of **11 goats** provided meat for more than **120 families**.

#### PAKISTAN

CWF conducted a Qurbani program, sacrificing **32 cattle** on behalf of generous donors. From these offerings, meat was distributed to **3,152 families**. Additionally, **7 goats** were sacrificed, yielding approximately 68 kg of meat for distribution. In total, this year Qurbani Program reached **3,220 families**, ensuring that the spirit of giving extends far and wide, bringing joy and sustenance to those in need.

The CWF's Sadaqa Program has been conducted **13** times, showcasing its steadfast dedication to assisting those in need. Through this initiative, **57 cattle**, **1 goa**t, and **2 lambs** were sacrificed, benefiting **4**,**935 families**.

The CWF's Aqeeqa program provided solace and sustenance to **160 families** by sacrificing five goats and **1 cattle.** This act epitomizes compassion and underscores the Foundation's steadfast commitment to uplifting communities in need.

## HOUSING & WATER (\$18,571.10)

#### INDIA

In Bihar, **3 houses** with two rooms, a toilet, a kitchen area, and proper iron doors and windows, were built for needy families, to protect the girls in the families from any mishap, **6 bathrooms** were provided in the homes. Furthermore, **5 hand pumps** were installed in the houses to provide a clean and fresh water supply, thus saving the hardship of going out and bringing water.

#### PAKISTAN

The CWF has made a big difference by building **2 water projects**. One is in Sector 14-E in Orangi Town, and the other is in the Khairabad area of Northern By-Pass. These projects help **800 families** every day, benefiting around **5000** people. They are making sure that there's enough water for everyone, making life better for many.

The CWF extended its support to **2 families** in Karachi by covering their house rent. One recipient, who is handicapped due to cardiac issues, faces employment challenges, while the other is actively seeking employment. This assistance provided much-needed relief to both families facing housing insecurity.

## **STIPEND FOOD (\$62,207.21)**

#### INDIA

CWF provided monthly basic rations to more than **200 families** in Bihar and Jharkhand every month, mostly consisting of widows and elderly people. Additionally, a few other families were provided with pensions to cover their basic daily expenses. This was done to ensure that these families had access to the necessary resources to survive and to provide them with a sense of security and stability. The rations provided included food items such as rice & wheat.

We reached out to **145 families** in villages with 435 kilograms of mangoes. It enabled them to enjoy nutritious seasonal food during the summer season.

#### PAKISTAN

The CWF distributed essential provisions and inaugurating a novel daily ration initiative. A total of **350 families** were recipients of this outreach. The monthly allocation of provisions ensures sustenance for a minimum of one month, catering to the needs of families comprising up to six members.

We provided daily meals to **70 families** for 69 days, comprising a nutritious serving of curry and Naan. Throughout this period, a total of **28,980** deserving individuals received sustenance, embodying the foundation's unwavering commitment to alleviating hunger and nourishing communities.

It also extended a lifeline of sustenance by offering a 10 kg bag of flour at an incredibly affordable rate of only **\$1.80** to **500 families**. This visionary initiative was meticulously crafted with the sole purpose of bolstering the livelihoods of hardworking individuals. Through this endeavour, a staggering 3000 souls found respite and support, all made possible by the benevolent outreach of the foundation.

#### INDIA

CWF organizes many programs in the holy month of Ramadan. It promotes the value of care and well-being for the underprivileged brothers and sisters.

In the hot summer month of Ramadan, free ice distribution was started in the year 2015. It helps people break their fast with cold soothing water. It reached more than **1,480 families** for the full month of Ramadan.

The Ramadan package program was started in the year 2008 and supports the entire family from the first day of Ramadan till the Eid celebration. This program provides all the household needs during Ramadan. Such families don't need to buy even salt or matchboxes for that month. It also includes groceries for the month and clothing for the day of Eid for an average family of six members. This year it helped **126 families** in different parts of Bihar and Jharkhand.

CWF distributed Sahoor and Iftar packages to **2,919 families** during Ramadan. These packages contained raw materials for iftar and sahoor and were enough for a two-person family for the entire month of Ramadan at two meals per day. The packages included items such as rice, oil, sugar, lintels, dates, and one-person clothing. The packages were intended to help families in need have enough food to break their fast and have a wholesome meal during the holy month. We also provided dry ration and clothes to **422 families**.

CWF provided both Eid packages and animal Sadaqa (animal sacrifice) to families in need a day before Eid, it includes **1,390** families. These packages contained chicken, lachcha (a type of item to make sweet), milk, and sugar, and were intended to help families in need celebrate Eid as a festival. The packages provided families with enough food to make a festive meal for Eid, and to break their fast specially. Some families received Goat/Cattle meat by Sadaqa (animal sacrifice) benefitting about **300 families** who usually don't get a sumptuous meal.

In this holy month, we also ran a clothing program by distributing new clothes to for **722** women, **142** men, and **1303** children to enjoy the festivity of Eid celebration.

CWF also provided **11 big meals** during Ramadan, reaching more than **6,200 people**. These meals contained delicacies such as pulao, gosht or biryani, and zarda, and were intended to help people break their fast with a special and wholesome meal.

CWF organized Eid fairs in the villages of Amarpur, Phuldeeh, Kawakol and Hasanpur in the Nawada district of Bihar. These fairs provided more than **5,000 children** with a fun and festive Eid day, with treats such as golgappe (a type of fried snack), chole (a type of chana curry) and ice cream. The fairs allowed children who were unable to celebrate Eid in a special way to enjoy the day and make it a memorable experience.

CWF provided more than **250 families** with some monetary support a few days before Eid. This was done at the special request of donors and was intended to help families cover miscellaneous needs prior to the Eid holiday.

#### PAKISTAN

CWF distributed milk and sugar to **125 families** as Zakat UI Fitr, benefiting 750 individuals in total.

The CWF, in a gesture of unwavering compassion, extended its hand of support by disbursing monthly provisions to **600 families** across Karachi during the sacred month of Ramadan. Through this benevolent act, a total of 3600 individuals found sustenance and solace in the form of essential rations throughout the month of Ramadan.

The CWF gave new clothes to **500 children** in Karachi to celebrate Eid-UI-Fitr. There were 250 sets for boys and 250 for girls. Instead of giving them clothes directly, we set up cloth stalls in our institution. The children got to pick out the clothes they liked and that fit them best. It made them happy to choose their own Eid clothes.



The CWF not only bestowed bangles and henna upon **2600 girls and women** but also orchestrated a delightful henna application event to uplift and inspire the feminine spirit.

During the last few days of Ramadan, the CWF did something really special. They organized a big event where they provided iftar to **850 people**. They planned everything carefully and worked with a lot of love. Their goal was to make sure that everyone who needed food during iftar time could have it. This act of kindness shows the true spirit of Ramadan and how dedicated the foundation is to bringing people together and helping those who are hungry.

## MOSQUE (\$15,455.74)

**2** mosques were built in the villages of Sariyya and Kamalpur in the Supaul District of Bihar. These mosques provide a facility for the five daily prayers. Both these mosques have been a blessing for the villagers, as it has allowed them to practice their faith which is also a source of pride and joy for the village community.

## VOCATIONAL TRAINING (\$3,115.60)

The CWF runs **8 Vocational Centers** to teach cutting and stitching clothes. This skill provides young girls and women with the opportunity to start small businesses in their villages and to help their families financially. More than **160 students** graduate every year from these centers, and upon graduation, they are provided with machines to start their profession and to help their families. This has been a great blessing for the people in these areas, as it has allowed them to have access to more opportunities and to be able to help families.

## **BUSINESS (\$24,656.80)**

#### INDIA

CWF aided individuals to start and expand business by providing interest free loans in various villages in Bihar and Jharkhand. This allowed the people in these areas to have access to more opportunities and to be able to make a living. The support provided to these businesses was invaluable and helped to improve the lives of many people.

The bag-making business has been extremely successful, it started in **2011**. It has not only employed **25 women** but has also helped them to become financially independent. These women are now able to support their families, as each woman earns an average of **INR 3,000 per month**. This business has improved the quality of life of these women and has enabled them to become productive members of society.

#### PAKISTAN

In a visionary move, the CWF unveiled a groundbreaking project in Karachi, aimed at directly aiding those who rely on motorcycles for their livelihoods. Launched on November 25th, 2023, this initiative swiftly alleviated the burden on motorcyclists by subsidizing 80% of their repair costs, thereby providing crucial relief to **199 bike riders**. This not only restored mobility but also reignited the flames of financial independence for 199 families, enabling them to resume their income-generating activities. Additionally, the project generated employment opportunities for approximately **10 families** engaged in motorcycle repair work. Undoubtedly, this innovative endeavor stands as a beacon of hope and progress in the bustling city of Karachi, offering a lifeline to those in need while fostering a culture of community support and resilience.

Helping in a pushcart to a diligent individual. This program marks the beginning of our commitment to empowering individuals to earn a sustainable income. Moving forward, we plan to expand this initiative by offering interest-free loans alongside, ensuring sustained support for those striving for self-sufficiency.

#### INDIA

#### **Marriage Support**

CWF helped to perform **3 marriages** and to purchase home basic items for the girls of the villages of Hargawan, Bijho, and Giridih. This was done to ensure that the girls had the necessary items to start their new lives and to provide them with a sense of security and stability.

#### Winter Program

Winter items like blankets and chadars were distributed to **1200 families** in the villages of Bihar and Jharkhand.

Volunteers who worked tirelessly for the organization were given gifts.

#### PAKISTAN

#### Marriage Support

The CWF generously provided meat for the wedding meals of **5 girls**, totalling around 200 kg, and also furnished the homes of **2** of the **brides** with essential furniture and kitchen items.

#### Winter Program

Embarking on a mission to bring warmth and comfort during Karachi's chilly winter, the CWF spread rays of hope by delivering cosy blankets to **1200 families** across various districts. Their inclusive approach ensured that the warmth reached beyond boundaries, embracing non-Muslim communities as well. Moreover, the foundation extended to **1500** deserving individuals, encompassing children, adults, the elderly, and students from diverse educational backgrounds with snug warm jackets.
